#### TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT

### YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2008

The Trustees have pleasure in presenting their report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 August 2008.

#### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

### Object of the charity

Manchester Pride Limited was formed in 2004 and converted into a charity in 2007. Its object is to promote equality and diversity for the public benefit and in particular the elimination of discrimination on the grounds of sexual orientation.

### **Legal status and Governing Document**

Manchester Pride is a company limited by guarantee, charity registration Number 1117848. The Charity is governed by the memorandum and articles of association for the incorporated company as last amended on 19 December 2006. The directors of the charitable company are its Trustees for the purpose of charity law and throughout this report are collectively referred to as the Trustees. The governing documents instruct the trustees to act in a way to promote the objects of the Charity. The Trustees had no beneficial interest in the charitable company.

### **Subsidiary Company**

The Charity has a wholly owned trading subsidiary Manchester Pride Events Limited, which is incorporated in the United Kingdom. The group statement of financial activities shows the total income receivable and total expenditure payable by the subsidiary.

## Appointment, induction and training of the Trustees

Recruitment to the Board of Trustees is normally by invitation to individuals with the relevant skills and experience to strengthen the governance of the organisation. It is usual for potential trustees to attend a meeting with one or two members of the Board plus a member of staff and then to be co-opted onto Board.

The induction process includes the provision of relevant background written material.

#### Organisational structure

The Annual General Meeting of the Charity elects the Trustees and Honorary Officers, appoints Auditors and considers and adopts the Annual Report and Audited Accounts for the preceding year's activities.

#### The Infrastructure

The management team consists of a full time Festival Manager and a full time Deputy Festival Manager supported by a freelance Sponsorship Manager and Event / Production Manager. The organization continues with a lease on a small office in Ducie House.

### Delegation

Subject to their compliance with the above reporting regime, the day to day management of the organisation is delegated to the Festival Manager and Deputy Festival Manager.

### Financial control

Budgets are presented and approved at the beginning of the financial year and monitored throughout the year.

### Reporting requirements

At the regularly monthly meetings of the Board of Trustees, financial management accounts are considered, along with statements on cash and reports on income generation and expenditure against budgets. Staff and other management issues are regularly received by the Board.

Reporting is by the Festival Manager and Deputy Festival Manager or any senior member of the management team. So far as possible the Board's focus is on strategic, financial and fundraising issues. In this context, from time to time the Trustees and senior managers meet for longer periods for business planning purposes.

### Risk Management

The Trustees acknowledge their continuing responsibility for identifying the major risks faced by the charity, keeping those risks under review and taking appropriate steps to manage those risks.

## AIMS, OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The Objects of Manchester Pride are to promote equality and diversity for the public benefit and in particular the elimination of discrimination on the grounds of sexual orientation, including in particular but not exclusively by:

- raising the awareness of the public with regard to all aspects of discrimination in society and issues and difficulties affecting the lives of lesbian, gay and bisexual and transgender (LGBT) people
- cultivating a sentiment in favour of equality and diversity in particular through celebrating the diversity of the LGBT community
- advancing education in equality and diversity whether by teach or producing materials
- associating with voluntary organisations, governmental, public and private bodies to develop and maximise the effectiveness of voluntary organisations run by and for LGBT people
- producing publications, lectures, media, public advocacy and other means of communication
- staging an annual LGBT festival and:

such other objects as are charitable under the laws of England and Wales as the trustees shall at their absolute discretion determine.

The activities of the Charity shall be undertaken in particular but not exclusively in Greater Manchester (the area of benefit).

## Volunteers

The activities depend heavily on the contribution of over eighty unpaid volunteers to whom Manchester Pride is greatly indebted.

## Funding

The activities depend heavily on the support and financial contributions by the funding organisations AGMA, Arts Council and Manchester City Council to whom Manchester Pride is greatly indebted.

### **Sponsors**

The activities depend heavily on the support and financial contribution of the event Sponsors to whom Manchester Pride is greatly indebted.

#### **Partner Organisations**

The activities depend upon having the support and contributions from its partner organisations, the Village Business Association, George House Trust, the Lesbian and Gay Foundation and Marketing Manchester, to whom Manchester Pride is great indebted.

#### Members of the Public

The activities depend heavily on the support and contributions of the many individuals who purchased tickets to the event and who made donations direct to the charity to whom Manchester Pride is greatly indebted.

### Activities of the subsidiary trading company

Manchester Pride Events Limited was principally engaged to organise and manage the annual LGBT festival. The company gifted all of its profits to Manchester Pride.

#### **ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE**

On 6 February 2007 Manchester Pride Limited achieved its long term aim of becoming a charity and this year Manchester Pride Limited raised £115 000 for distribution to HIV/AIDS and LGBT charities and projects in Greater Manchester.

Ticket prices increased for the first time since 2003. Attendance at the Manchester Pride Festival was over thirty eight thousand tickets, which were purchased either online, through ticket outlets or form the on site box office over the weekend. It was felt once again that improved programme of activity over the weekend helped to secure ticket sales. The structure and quality of entertainment has been refined and developed over the past few years to cater to a variety of tastes and fulfill certain requirements.

This year's event focused on the celebration of 18 years of Pride events taking place within Manchester. The event attracted iconic performers such as Boy George, Sophie Ellis Bextor, Roisin Murphy, Heather Small and Alphabeat, complimented by alternative music, Proms in the Park and the addition of the cabaret and comedy performance area. Manchester Pride successfully delivered two exhibitions in conjunction with Imperial War Museum North and URBIS, along with a strong programme of cultural and community activities within the 10 day festival.

This year saw the largest increase in commercial sponsorship to date, attracting new partners such as the Argent Group and McArthur Glen, demonstrating the successful development of the festival year on year.

The Parade which is held on the Saturday and is the free element of the weekend continued to attract a large and mixed audience and this year had a record number of floats which over seventy five entries. Also whilst it is impossible to provide an accurate number for the audience, the parade route was lined by people on both sides from the beginning to the end, which is over a mile long.

## TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT (continued)

Finally one of the main objectives of the festival is to provide a safe, relaxed and enjoyable event predominately for the LGBT community and this year was the lowest number of recorded crime figures as collated by Greater Manchester Police. These figures are credit to the close working relationship Manchester Pride Limited has with all emergency services as well as the local authority.

#### **FINANCIAL REVIEW**

### Review of the financial positions during the year ended 31 August 2008

The results for the year, and the charity's financial position at the end of the year are shown in the attached financial statements.

#### **Principal Funding Sources**

Of the £898,940 income for the year just over two thirds was raised from ticket sales: £120,000 was received by sponsorship in the trading subsidiary, £60,697 was by contribution or donations and £33,490 by grants. The remaining income was raised by trading activities and other activities during the Big Weekend.

#### Principal Expenditure Items

Of the £766,872 expenditure for the year over two thirds was spent on the delivery of the Big Weekend event which is the annual LGBT festival. Out of the remainder only 11% was spent on administration and 3% on Professional fees.

### **Donations**

The policy is to make donations of money to HIV and LGBT charities and organisations particularly but not exclusively in Greater Manchester and Lancashire. The monies are to be distributed 50% to HIV charities and organisations and 50% to LGBT charities and organisations. In addition, the Board agreed to make a grant of £10,000 towards the work of Queer Up North to assist it's promotion of the arts to LGBT community.

## **Reserves Policy**

The charity's policy is to seek to achieve a level of minimum reserves equivalent to approximately 3 months of the charity's overheads. At the end of the year the level of reserves was £67,594.

### **Investment Policy**

There is not an investment policy: it is not a material part of the charity's activity.

#### PLANS FOR THE FUTURE PERIODS

The charity's aims and key objectives for 2008/9 are:

- to continue to work with our partner organisations to raise awareness of the public with regards to the issues and difficulties affecting the lives of lesbian, gay and bisexual and transgender (LGBT) people;
- to continue to work with voluntary organisations, governmental, public and private bodies to develop and maximise the effectiveness of voluntary organisations run by and for LGBT people;
- to continue to develop the profile of the annual LGBT festival as a flagship Pride event;
- to continue to develop the capabilities of the annual LGBT festival as a fundraising event for HIV / AIDS and LGTB charities and organisations in Greater Manchester.

#### STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES RESPONSIBILITIES

The trustees are responsible for preparing the annual report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice.

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the profit or loss of the company for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, applicable accounting standards and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: (revised 2005)" (SORP 2005).

#### Consolidation

The group financial statements consolidate those of the charity and its subsidiary undertaking for the year ended 31 August 2008.

### Turnover

Turnover represents sales to external customers at invoiced amounts less value added tax. Turnover consists of sponsorship and entrance fees to the Pride festival. Income for sponsorship is recognised on an accruals basis and entrance fees are recognised when the Pride event occurs.

### Cash flow statement

The directors have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No. 1 (revised) from including a cash flow statement in the accounts on the grounds that the charity qualifies as a small company.

### Donations and gifts

All monetary donations and gifts-are-included in full in the statement of financial activities when receivable.

Cash collected to which the charity is legally entitled but which has not been received at the year end is included as income.

### Grants receivable

Revenue grants are credited as incoming resources when they are receivable provided conditions for receipt have been complied with.

## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

## YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2008

### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised when it is incurred and is reported gross of related income on the following basis:

- Cost of generating funds comprises the costs associated with attracting voluntary income and the costs of other income generation.
- Governance costs include those costs incurred in the governance of the Charity and are associated with constitutional and statutory requirements.
- Charitable activities relate to donations payable to HIV and LGBT charities and organisations, particularly but not exclusively, in Greater Manchester and Lancashire.

### Fund accounting

All of the funds received by the charity are unrestricted and are used for expenditure on the general objectives of the charity.

#### Irrecoverable VAT

All resources expended are classified under activity headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. Irrecoverable VAT is charged against the category of resources expended for which it was incurred.
